# On the Job Learning After obtaining their own employment, apprentices also receive on-the-job learning by working with an experienced journeyman throughout their training. A total of 8,000 hours of OJL is required for completion.

## Associate's Degree While participating in the apprenticeship program, students may obtain an Associate's Degree from Vincennes University at no additional cost.

#### NCCER Accreditation

Curriculum utilized in the apprenticeship program is through NCCER, a nationally recognized certification. By utilizing a standardized curriculum throughout the industry, employers can be assured of an apprentice's knowledge and skills upon completion of the program.

### **Carpentry Apprenticeship**



Apprentices attend school for 4 years. Classes are held one night per week for 3 hours with 3 hours of online study. All programs are approved by the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship.
