Apprentices attend school for 4 years. Classes are held one night per week for 3 hours with 3 hours of online study. All programs are approved by the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship.

On the Job Learning

After obtaining their own employment, apprentices also receive on-the-job learning by working with an experienced journeyman throughout their training. A total of 8,000 hours of OJL is required for completion.

Associate's Degree

While participating in the apprenticeship program, students may obtain an Associate's Degree from Vincennes University at no additional cost.

NCCER Accreditation

Curriculum utilized in the apprenticeship program is through NCCER, a nationally recognized certification. By utilizing a standardized curriculum throughout the industry, employers can be assured of an apprentice's knowledge and skills upon completion of the program.
